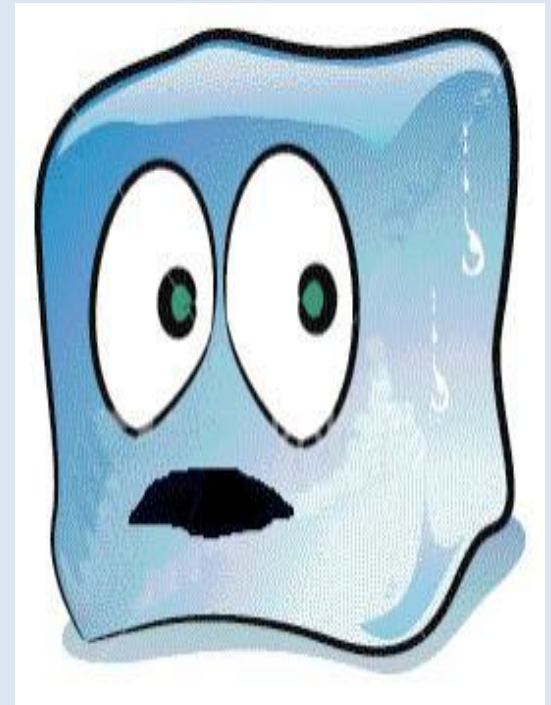

Project MALE Incentive Program

During the Project MALE program year, students may earn points/dollars based on their behavior, attendance, and participation in class or other program-related activities. At a designated time, students will be allowed to trade in those points/dollars for some items they want or need.

Examples of Activities to Earn Points

- Arrive to class on time
- Work on a project
- Answer a question
- Get a parent/guardian to attend a session
- Offer a suggestion or recommendation
- Demonstrate leadership
- Read a book or article and write a paper about it
- Introduce himself to an adult
- Participate in a community service project
- Define a problem
- Find a new friend

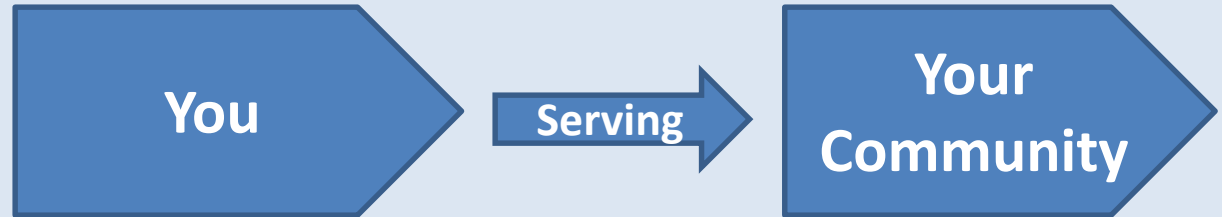
